

Manual

- Driver calls dispatch- Serviced Y/N- states type of contamination
- Dispatch logs down
- Dispatch generates 1st offense contamination letter
- 2nd offense Code Inspector
- 3rd offense Cart removed
- Dispatch puts notes in database
- Dispatch mails letter
- Dispatch generates daily contamination list


Dispatch Software

 Driver logs down issue/ on board computer pull down menu

- Automatic Notification to dispatch for letter
- Dispatch mails letter
- Dispatch puts notes in database

Dispatch Software Enhancements

- Drivers don't have to guess which address
- Real time photos
- On board computer
- Asset identification
- Assisted service identification
- Put out rates
- Proof of service



Manual Data July 2016-Dec 2016

- 882 1st offense letters sent
- 138 2nd violation Code Inspector visits
- 35 3rd violation cart removals
- Based on 174,000 households letters are sent to .005 % of households
