




























## SAVE A TASTY LICHAR

Every year in Scotland we throw away over 600,000 tonnes - or £1 billion worth - of food. That's £460 a year, or £38 a month, for the average household. Some of it is just peelings and bones, but most of it is good food that we simply didn't get around to eating.





Value is lost by breaking products back down into components and materials




















